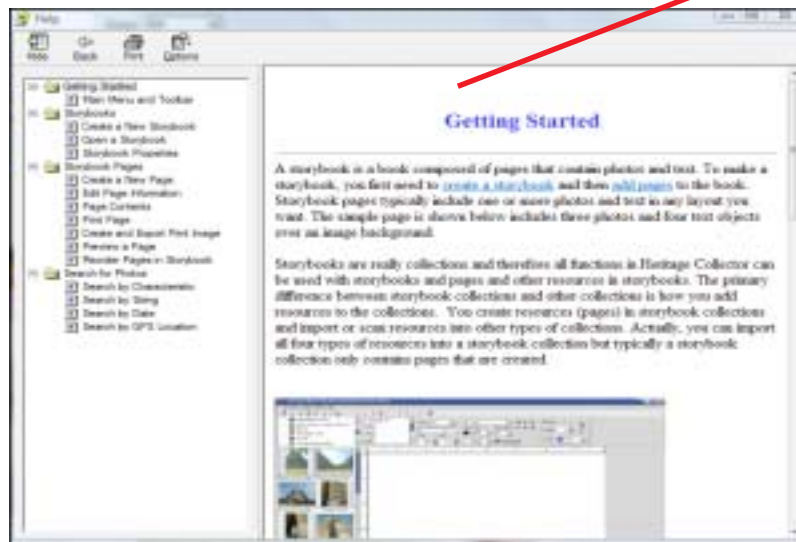

We had a 100 head of cattle and 300 hogs. Two in the white horse.

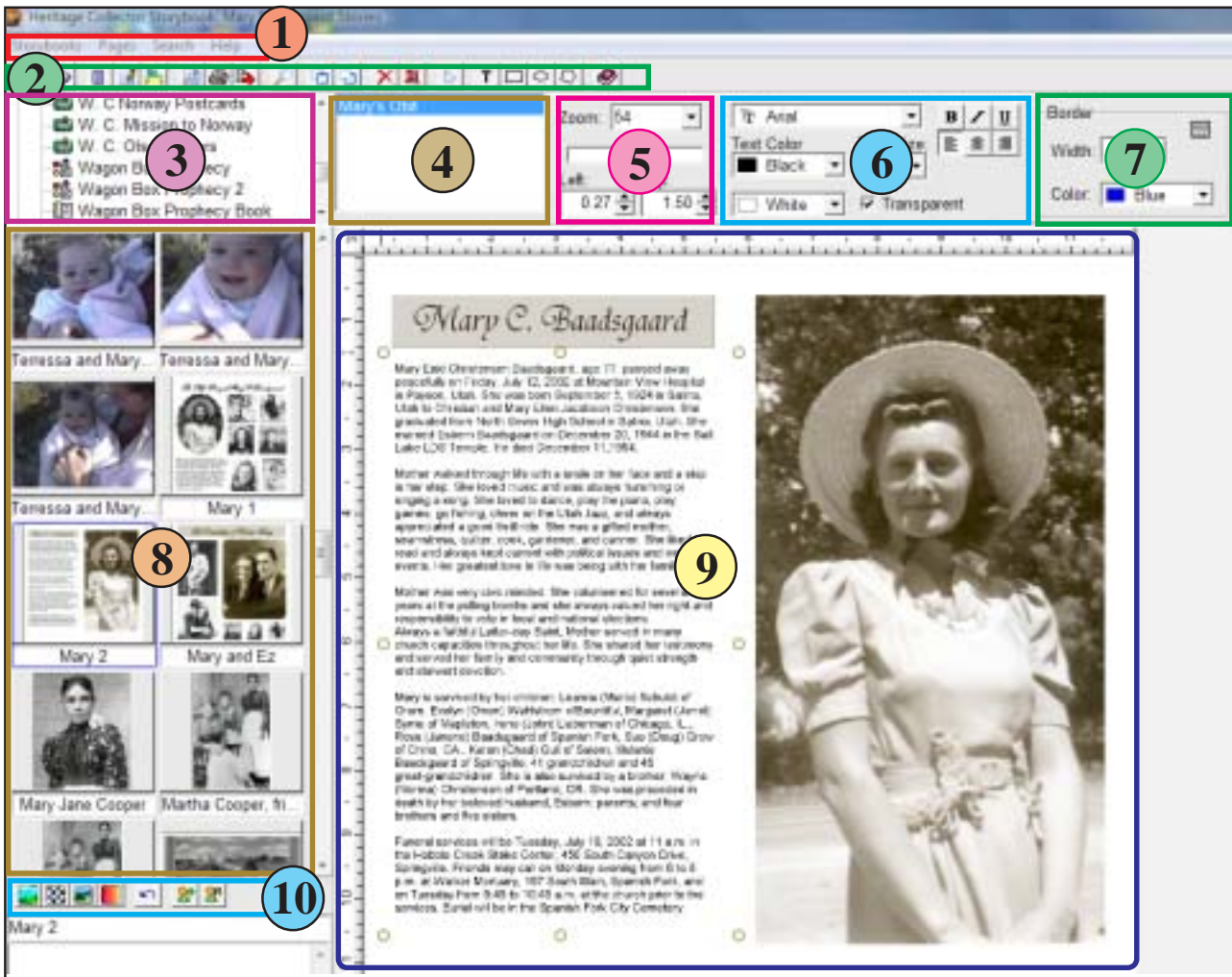
Dad had one of the best Hereford White Face herds around.

## The Main Display

A storybook is composed of pages containing photos and text. Pages may include one or more photos and text in a personalized layout you create. Storybooks and pages are created from the Main Display shown below.

## Toolbar

The toolbar shown below allows access many of the functions by clicking one of the icons .Placing your mouse on one of the icons will cause a tip to appear indicating what each icon will do when clicked.

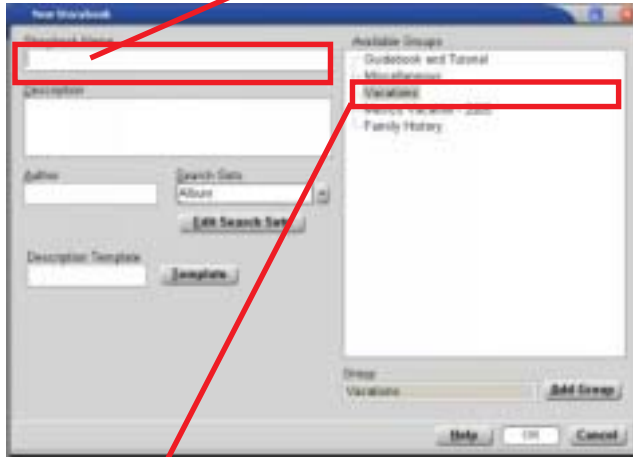


## Getting Started

**Create a Storybook.** Storybooks are used to store and organize storybook pages.

1. Click the Storybook menu item or the blue Storybook icon. Click New. The following display will appear.

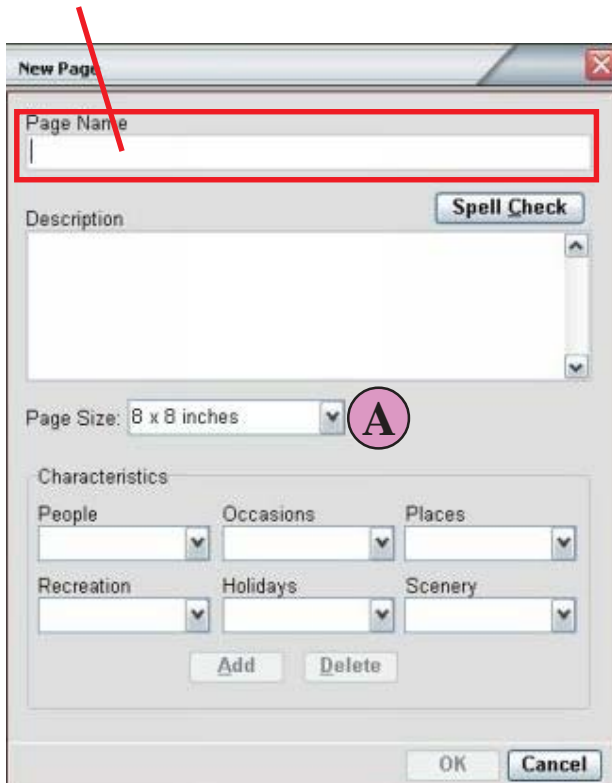
Type in a storybook name. Other information is optional.



Select a group in which the storybook will be created in Heritage Collector. Select Miscellaneous if you have not created any groups.

## Create a Storybook Page

Click the Page menu option. Type in a storybook page name.



## Select a Page Size

Select a page size for your storybook page (See bottom left of this page).

- A 4 x 6 inches (portrait)
- 6 x 4 inches (landscape)
- 5 x 7 inches (portrait)
- 7 x 5 inches (landscape)
- 8 x 10 inches (portrait)
- 10 x 8 inches (landscape)
- 8 x 8 inches
- 9 x 9 inches
- 12 x 12 inches

The rest of the information is optional. Click Ok to create the page. You are now ready to begin adding a background, photos and text to the page.

## Select a Background

A Storybook page may have one of the three types of backgrounds as shown below:



Solid Color

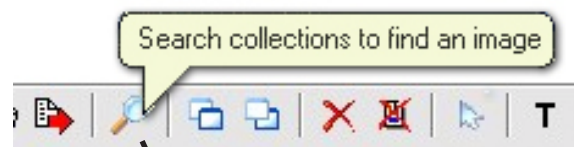
Image as a Tile (small repeating images)

Image (photo)

## Finding Images and Backgrounds

Storybook uses the same search options and process as Heritage Collector. Consult your Heritage Collector manual or click the Help button for information about searching.

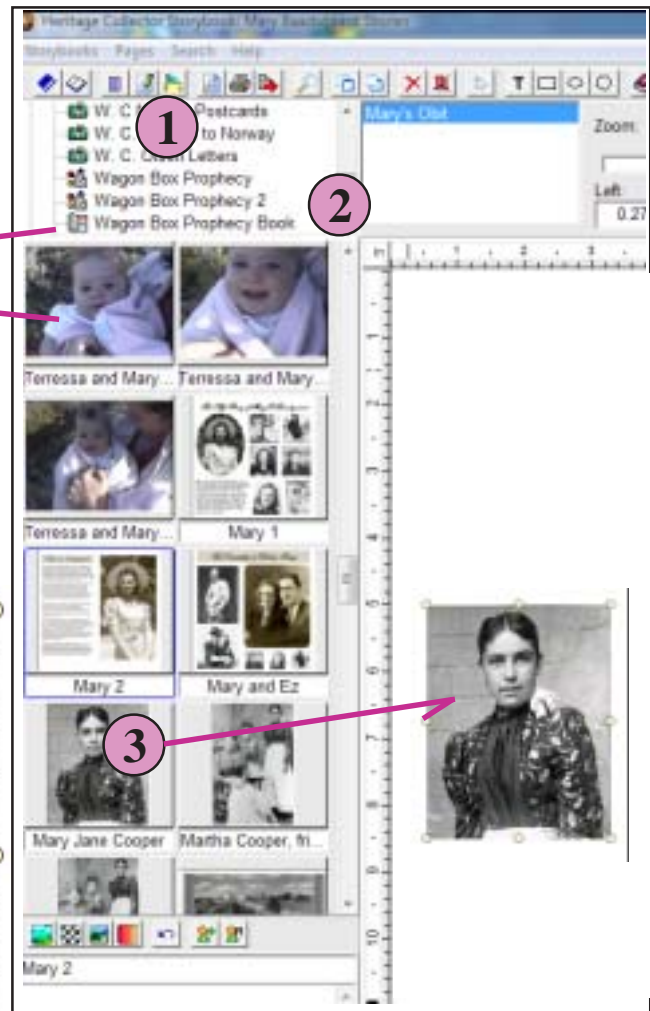


Click on the Search icon and enter search criteria to find a specific photo or background image.

## Adding Images

Photos are easy to add to a page.

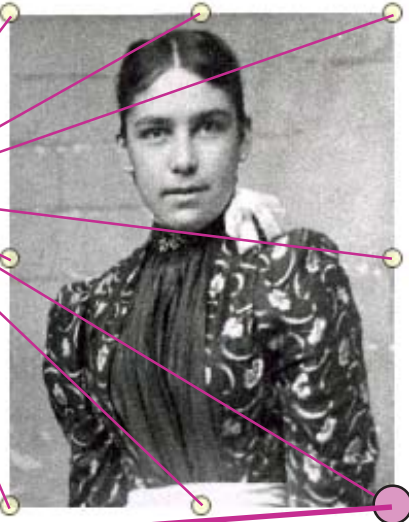
- 1 Select a collection from the collection list or scroll up or down show more collection names.
- 2 Click a collection name to display thumbnail images
- 3 Select an image. Click on the image and hold the left mouse button down. Drag the image to the page and release the mouse button.



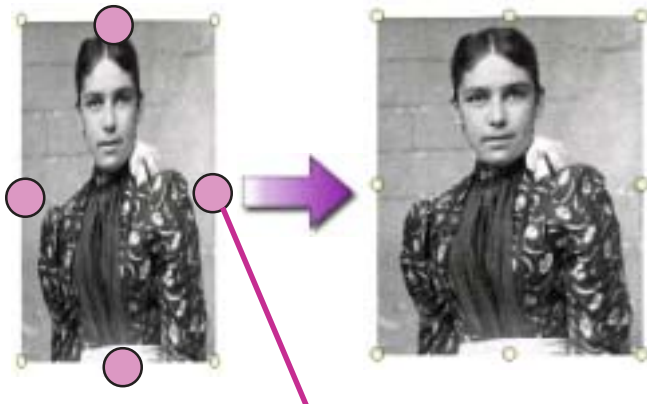
## Resize a Photo

Click one of the little yellow "handles."

Drag in the direction you would like to resize the photo.



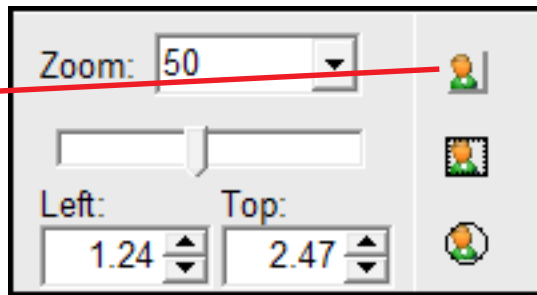
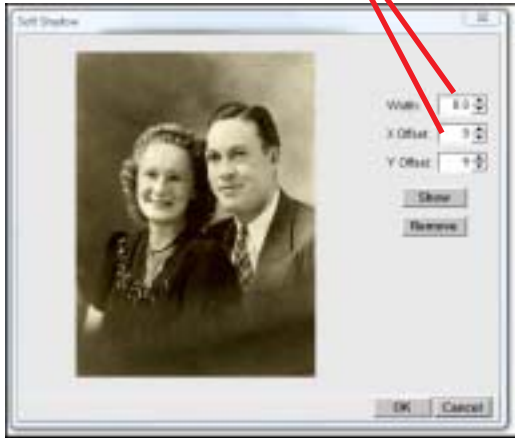
Corner handles increase or decrease the size of the photo proportionally so it will not become "stretched" or distorted.



Dragging one of the other handles will allow you to correct a distorted image by stretching the image in the direction to correct the distortion as shown above.

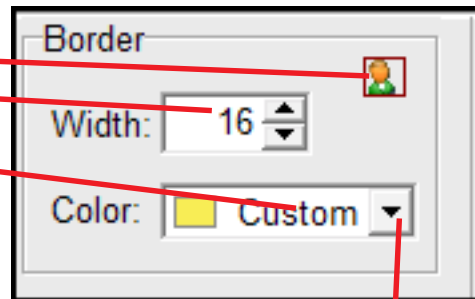
## Add a Border and/or Shadow

Click on the image on the storybook page.  
Select the soft shadow option.  
Select the amount of shadow.



## Add a Border

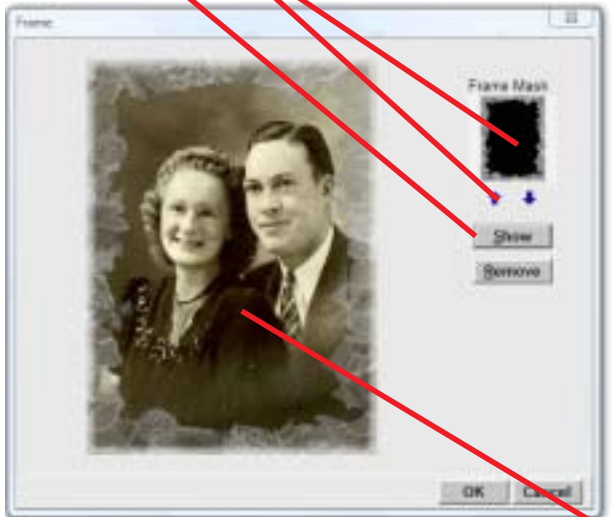
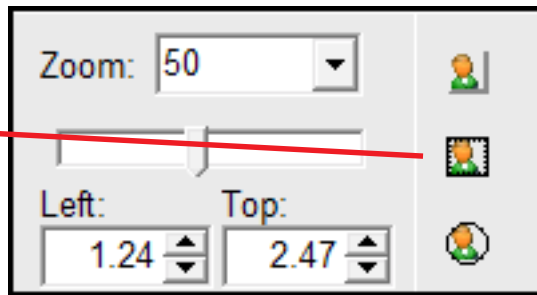
Click on the image on the storybook page.  
Select the border option.  
Select the size of the border.  
Select the color.



Select the photo and the option to remove or change the shadow or border.

## Add a Frame

Click on the image on the storybook page.  
Select the Frame option.  
Select a Frame.  
View Frame.

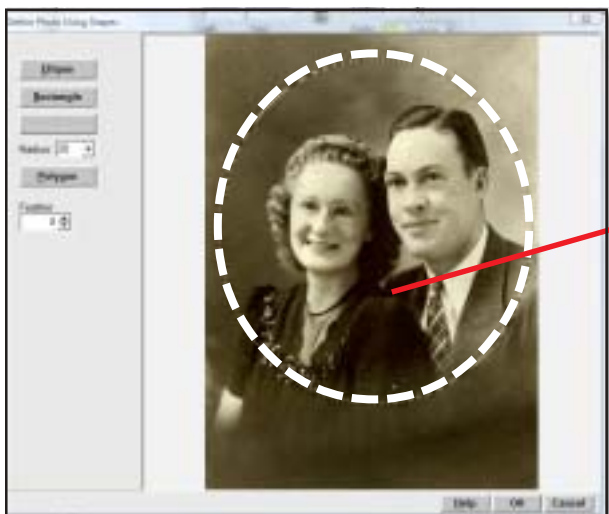
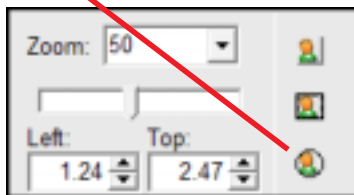


## Change Photo Shape

Click on the image the storybook page.  
Select the Shape option.

Select Ellipse or Rectangle.

Drag the mouse over the image to create the shape as shown below.



## Add Text

Click on Text icon.  
Click in the white space in the text box and type.

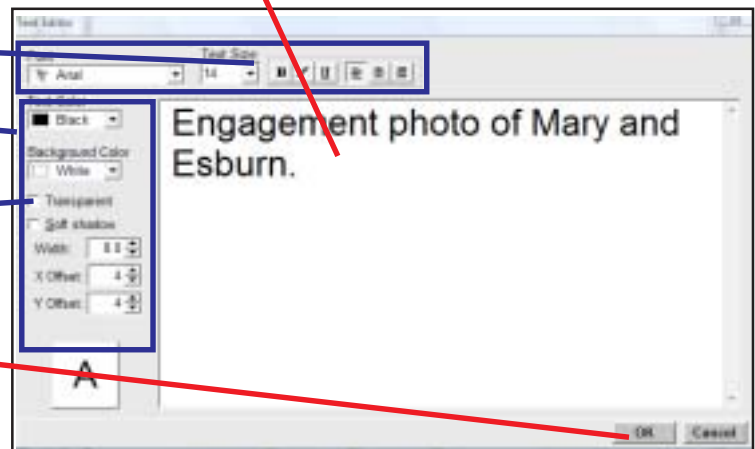


Several different text attributes (bold, center, color, etc.) may be changed by clicking on the option.

Type text, select attributes.

Select the Transparent option to remove the box behind the text.

Click the OK button.



Click on the new text box on the page and drag it to the desired location. Drag the handles on the text box to change the size and shape of the text box. Double click on the text to select and edit or make changes.

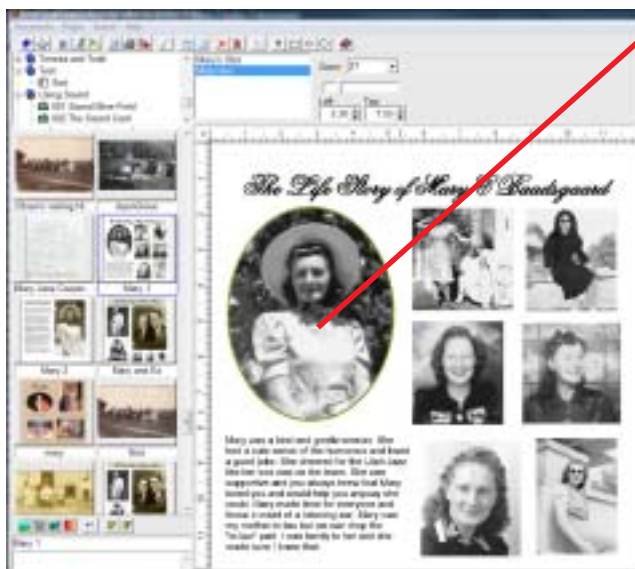
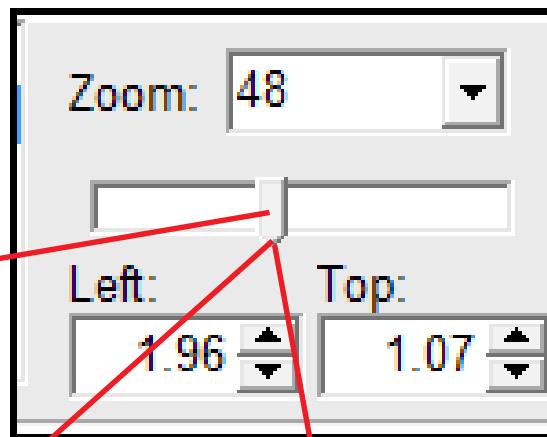
Click the Manual icon for information about text options.

## Zoom In

Zooming in on the page will make it easier to work on the page for editing text and aligning objects.

Click on the Zoom Control pointer and drag the pointer to the right or left.

Once the zoom has been selected you may also use the mouse wheel to zoom in and out.



Zoom set at 25 allowing you to see the full page.



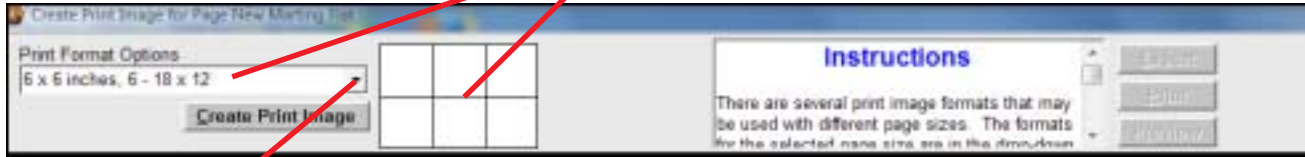
Zoom set at 48 allowing you to see the text and photos larger.

## Create the Print Image and Export

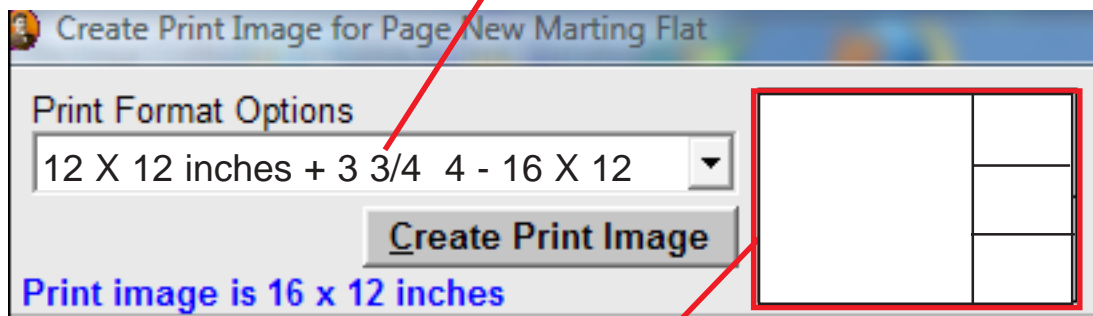
Storybook pages may be printed or exported so you can print the page using your favorite professional printing service. Click on the Print and Image and Export Icon. The following options will appear at the top of your display.



This window displays a variety of print formats.



Click the down arrow to select a print format option as shown below. Clicking on the Create Print Image button will display a sample of the output on your display.

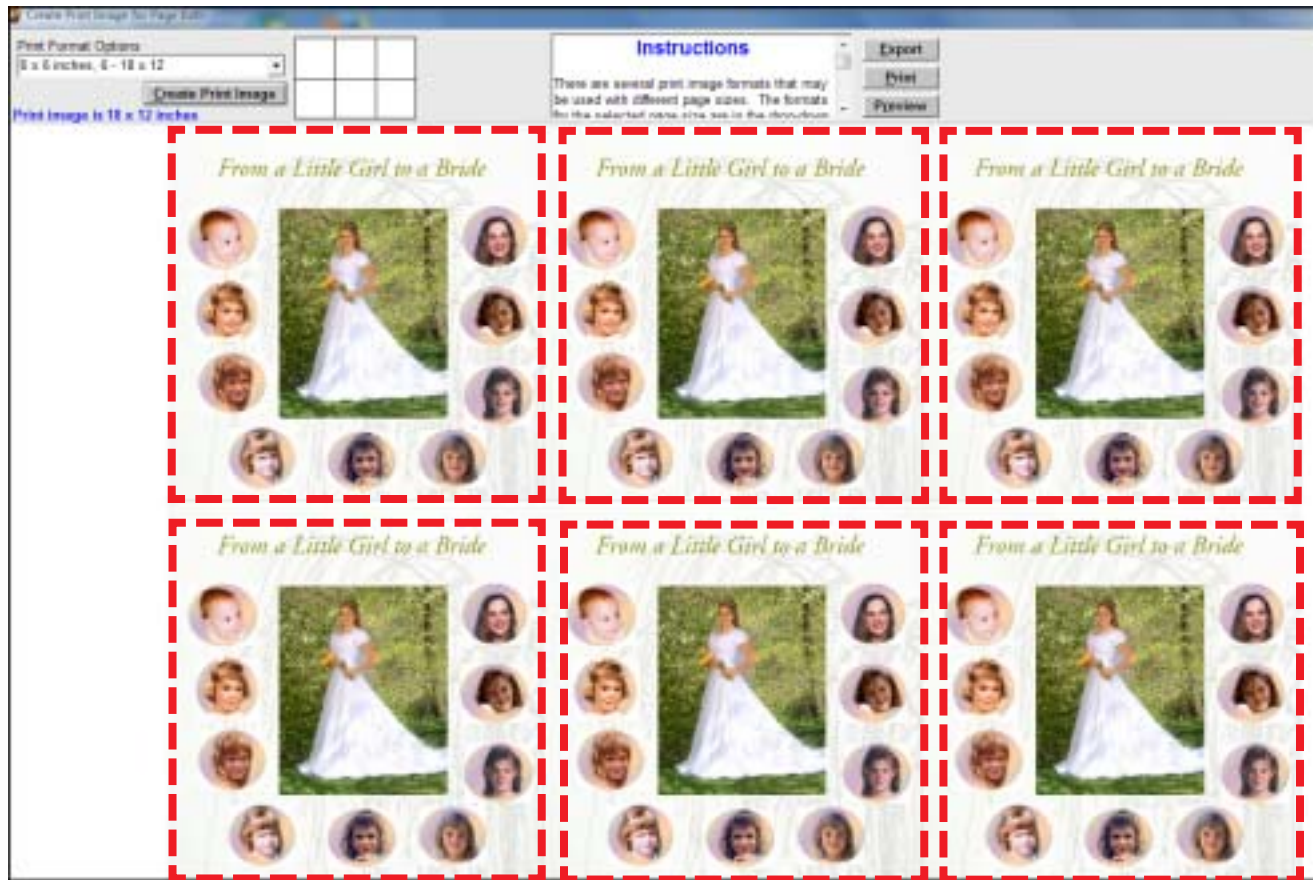


Selecting a different print format will display print format in this window. Selecting this format will create a print image 12 X 16 inch image. When cut apart this image will have one large 12 X 12 image with three 4 X 4 inch images. This is an example of a way to save money by getting several photos from one page.

**Please note - your print service will need to be able to print an image that is 12 x 16 inches.**



Selecting the 6 X 6 , 6 - 18 X 12 will print six duplicate pages on a 12 X 18 page.



**Please Note - your print service will need to be able to print an image that is 12 x 18 inches if you want to print the same format as shown above.**

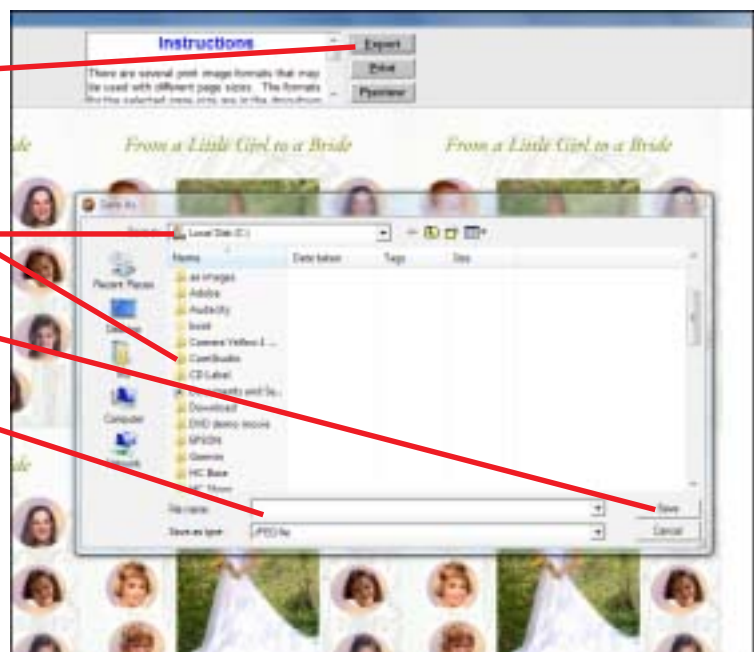
### Create the Image File for Printing

Click the Export button to create a JPG image file that can be used to print the image on the paper size and format previously selected.

The Save As display option will appear. Select where to save the image (Drive and folder).

Type in a file name and click Save.

You are now ready to copy the file to a CD/DVD, thumb drive or e-mail the image file to your printing service.



## Preview a Page

The Preview button allows you to view the page full screen. If full size is too large to fit on the screen you can use the scroll bars to scroll the entire page. Screen size displays the page as large as possible.

The page is shown below as it was displayed as large as possible. Click the Full Size button will show the page full size. The caption of the button is changed to Fit Size. Click the Fit Size button to display the page as large as possible.



## Print a Page

The Print function will print the image on your printer. Before printing, save the page to create the page file by combining the photo and text objects with the background to generate the image file. To save the page, click the Save button or select Save in the Pages drop-down menu.

Click the Print button or select Print in the Pages drop-down menu to print the page image. The Print Setup option box will be displayed so you can select a printer and properties. Page sizes that are too large to print full size on your printer will be scaled down for printing. To print these pages full size use the Export function to create a print image that can be exported and taken to a print processing facility that has the capability to print the image full size.

Page files can also be printed in Heritage Collector using any of the various print options. The Print Selected Photo is useful for the 4 x 6, 5 x 7 and 8 x 10 inch page sizes (both portrait and landscape).

## Open a Storybook

The last storybook you were working in will automatically be opened so you can continue working on the storybook. However, if you have more than one storybook, you may want to open a different storybook to work on it.

To open a storybook, click the Open storybook button or select Open in the Storybook drop-down menu. The Open storybook dialog box shown below is opened.

Select the storybook in the list and click the OK button to close the dialog box and open the selected storybook.

The pages in the storybook will be listed in the box shown below which is to the right of the tree box that shows the collections.

You can now select a page in the list to display the page and work on it or create new pages for the storybook.
