The solution to the big problem is so small it will fit in the palm of your hand!

It's called an external hard drive. There are many on the market. My personal favorite is the little Western Digital Passport drive shown to the right. This little drive holds 160 gigs, is powered by the USB port so all I have to do is plug it into another computer.

Now I can easily take ALL my family history photos, sound files, video clips and text documents anywhere I want to travel even on the plane.

It boggles my mind. Instead of filling up the back seat of my car, all I need to take is this little drive. I don't even have to worry about it being stolen or damaged since I can put it in my shirt pocket for safe keeping and protection.

I hope I have just changed your mind about taking and sharing all your family history materials to the next family reunion or gathering. I have even more exciting news to tell you about.

LifeStory has just released a new software version that makes it possible to install Heritage Collector on any external hard drive.

You can now take ALL your family history collections with you on the drive and run the Heritage Collector software just like you were at home using your computer. Just plug the drive into the USB port of another computer and you are ready to use the program.

So what's the catch?

None that I can think of.

Expensive Software upgrade? No.

If you're running Heritage Collector just download the free upgrade on the support site.

If you are using ProMedia Manger all you need to do is order and download the inexpensive upgrade.

The new 4.3 version of Heritage Collector Professional will allow you to do the following.

All functions are available when running Heritage Collector from an external drive.

- * Vacations.
- * Holidays.
- * Anywhere you have access to a computer.

When You Get Home:

- * Plug the drive into your computer.
- * Run Heritage Collector.
- * Select Tools / Sync.
- * New information and collections are compared and copied into Heritage Collector on your home computer.
